Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

(Philippians 4:6-9, NRSV)

It is 81 degrees outside and I realize the absurdity of the fact that I am currently wearing a sweatshirt. Why am I wearing a hoodie in the sweltering heat of a southern July? Well, for starters, I'm cold. I have pondered this all morning – am I sick? (temp is normal and I feel fine.) Am I getting old? (Yes, I am getting old but I'm not quite one of those year-round sweater-wearing ladies that complain when temps drop below 90.) So the only thing I can figure is that my body has not readjusted to North Carolina weather.

My family and I just returned from a week in Las Vegas. I felt silly for going in the middle of summer but everyone assured me, "Don't worry, it is a dry heat." Would you like to know what I discovered? Dry heat is horrible! I can't breath in dry heat. In dry heat even the wind hurts because it is hot...and dry. In dry heat there is really no difference in "shade" temperature and "full sun" – it is ALL hot. I struggled greatly the first few days of temps reaching as high as 113. By the end of the week, however, I was better adjusted. I returned to my pattern of morning walks and enjoyed time taking in the sights of Vegas (although at times I saw more than I bargained for – whew). Now that I have returned home, my body is readjusting to the "cooler" temperatures. Overcast skies and 81 degrees feels downright cold to me at the moment. I am more aware of every breeze and I find the air conditioning a bit much so it is currently turned off.

As I sit here in my sweatshirt, this awareness reminds me of the Christian's need for a God-centered life. Our bodies adjust to the physical environment around us. In much the same way, our soul adjusts to the spiritual environment around us. If we surround ourselves with Godly things then this is the environment to which we get acclimated. In a Godly atmosphere we are more attuned to God's presence; we are more fully aware of the Spirit's nudging; we can see our own sinfulness more clearly. However, when we live in a god-less environment most of the time, then we are less spiritually aware of God's presence. God remains hidden and our sense of sinfulness and separation from God is diminished.

Our bodies adjust to our physical environment – our soul adjusts to our spiritual environment. Perhaps it isn't just the temperature that has me reflecting on this topic as much as just returning from "Sin City," a place in which impulse is rewarded and limits are discouraged. We always have fun with the saying, "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas." Only it doesn't really. What happens in Vegas, or in the privacy of your home, or in the workplace and public street is all part of the spiritual environment that affects the peace or the discontent of our soul.

Try keeping God an ever-present part of your day, adjust to a Godly environment and see the difference it makes in your life.

In June the pantry served 437 families (1343 people), 42 of whom were new. Total food distribution was 23,513 pounds!



Our regular offerings in June were \$12,131.00. The offering was down almost \$1,500 from May and down over \$4,500 from April. I hope this is not a trend, or we may have some serious deficits by the end of the year. Our expenses for the month were \$16,330.43 for a loss of (\$4,199.43). A major portion of our expenses and the loss was for the payment toward the new Fellowship Hall flooring which was unfunded in an amount of \$3,789. All other expenses paid



to date for the new floor have been paid by direct contributions. Even without the added flooring expense, we still would have had a deficit for the month of (\$410.43), and this is not good.

For the year ended June 30, 2015, our total offerings were \$85,271.52 and our total expenses were \$85,239.86, for a small surplus of \$31.66.

We praise God for His blessings, and we thank all who have contributed so generously to His church and its many ministries!

What's Up(stairs)?

Like Vacation Bible School, our July Workshop Rotation Sunday School lessons will be about faith. Our key verse is Hebrews 11:1, "To have faith is to be sure of the things we hope for, to be certain of the things we cannot see." (*GNT*) We will also use the version from *The Living Bible*: "What is faith? It is the confident assurance that something we want is going to happen. It is the certainty that what we hope for is waiting for us, even though we cannot see it up ahead."

Last Sunday we talked about some Bible people we have already studied who had faith. We learned that our faith grows the more we use it.

This month we will also learn that to have faith is to believe in something; to trust that it is so. Some people believe everything they are told. Others require proof for everything. Most people cannot have faith in something unless they know something about it. That is why God has always provided man with lots of proof of His existence and His love - so we can easily believe it and have faith in Him.

We can't see our whole future. Sometimes God just lets us see the next step. When we follow without seeing where we are going, that is called faith.

Through a study of multiple verses on fear and faith, students will learn that they can trust God. God knew that people would be afraid. The word "fear" is mentioned 326 times in the Bible. Over and over again, God says, "Do not be afraid."

"As Christians, we have to recognize that faith is perhaps the single most important aspect of Christianity. Without faith in Jesus Christ...we are are nothing. Faith in God, although it seems easy, will take a lifetime of effort to keep...Don't let your Faith waver when things in life don't go as planned. We should work hard every day to remember that Jesus Christ is our Savior and God is our Father - we should always have faith in
