Canyon.

I have heard that word by entire life. I know what it means: A deep ravine between two cliffs. I have studied canyons in school; I have seen pictures that help me associate what I learn with what one looks like. I can define the word canyon; I can show you pictures of what one looks like and tell you how most are formed. I can transfer my head knowledge to you in various ways so that you too can learn all I know about canyons.

I sat on a crowded van, being propelled up a narrow mountain road by a huge Hawaiian man with the unlikely name of Francis. He is telling us about his adventures as a professional fisherman and making me nervous because he seems convinced we don't believe his tales and therefore insists on scrolling through the camera roll on his cell phone to show us some of his greatest catches – all while still driving like mad up this winding narrow road. Suddenly he interrupts his fishing story and says, "Ok folks, I'm just going to whip the van off the road at this little pull off, its tricky but I think we can do it because the view is worth it." The loud gasp that went up among the 12 occupants of the van was a mix of terror at finding ourselves "whipped" to the very edge of a cliff and of breathtaking awe as we saw the glory of Waimea Canyon unfold below us.

Canyon.

My head could tell you what it is but now my heart can feel it as well. The Waimea Canyon on the Island of Kauai, was the first canyon I had ever seen with my own eyes and I realized there was no definition on earth that could help me understand it quite like experiencing it for myself.

Words are interesting things – we can learn them, fill ourselves with the head knowledge of their meanings and usage – but until you experience the word in a physical sense, you never fully grasp it.

As we prepare to enter the Advent/Christmas season we are reminded that the Word became flesh and lived among us. I invite you this year, don't just fill your heads with more knowledge about Jesus (the Word) – instead, experience Jesus in the physical sense. When we participate in acts of worship like prayer, communion, singing, and sharing in loving and generous acts, we come to see Jesus in ways that are much for awe inspiring than simply hearing about him.

You can't really know a Word without first experiencing it.



Bonnie, Alec, Kathleen, and Rosemary Hege have presented a Paschal Candle to the church to celebrate the 72nd anniversary of their parents, Hubert and Mary Lillian Hege.

The flame of the Paschal candle symbolizes the eternal presence of Christ, light of the world in the midst of his people. The Paschal candle is sometimes referred to as the "Easter candle" or the "Christ candle."

The candle remains lit at all worship services throughout Easter season ... during which time it is located in the sanctuary close to the altar. It is also lit and placed near the casket or urn during funeral services. This is to signify the hope of the resurrection into which Christians are baptized.



Our regular offerings were \$16,399.00 for October, which is

our second best offering this year. Since our expenses were relatively low at \$13,160.95; we ended up with a surplus of \$3,238.05 for the month. This is wonderful! For the year ending October 31, 2015, our total offerings were \$140,891.16, and our total expenses were \$141,593.98, for a deficit of (\$702.82). This is not good, but it is so much better than our deficit last month of (\$3,940.87). Praise God!

We can easily overcome this deficit by the end of the year, but remember that beginning on November 8, we will welcome our new youth pastor, Amanda Batten. This is an investment in the future of our church, and it is a great blessing, but the blessing comes with a cost of \$2,000 per month. To cover our increased expenses in the future, our offerings will need to increase by an equal amount. This will not be easy, but if our offerings remain



at the level they were for October, we will be in good shape.

Thank you all for your generosity and faithfulness; and remember that if we all work together, with God's help, we can do great things here at Mt. Olivet. Thanks be to God!

When disaster strikes, The United Methodist Church is dedicated to helping people recover and get their lives back. From Early Response Teams to long-term recovery, the people of The United

Methodist Church are on the ground providing prayer, relief, and resources.

Following devastating flooding in early October South Carolina is slowly moving from relief to recovery. With at least 80,000 people reporting flood damage, long-term recovery could take not just months but years. Bishop Jonathan Holston said. "The answer to an unprecedented weather event in South Carolina causing extensive flooding across the state is an unprecedented relief and recovery effort... We are a connectional church and the evidence that we're not alone is seen in the tremendous response to our needs... As the waters continue to subside around the state, I am grateful for the evidence of God's faithfulness in the midst of loss and destruction."

The first of many recovery teams from our sub-district will leave Sunday for South Carolina. Please keep them in your prayers as they travel and work.

What's Up(stairs)?



Committed Disciples 2016

When Jesus walked up to someone and said, “follow me,” he was asking for more than a once a week nod in his direction. The call to follow Jesus is the call to be a disciple, which means it is a call to a lifetime of commitment. If you read the Gospels you will notice that none of them started out very good at being disciples: they didn’t really know how to pray, they often excluded people instead of witnessing to them, they were physically with Jesus but didn’t always give him their undivided attention, they argued over who should have the most, and sometimes they tried to run people off so they didn’t have to work so hard. It took time for them to grow into committed disciples who would give all of themselves to prayer, presence, gifts, service and witness – but once they did so, they helped change the world.

This past month we have been exploring the topic of Stewardship, which has been defined at the tangible ways our discipleship is shown to the world. One tangible way is by our gift of tithing (giving God 10% of our income for his work in the world.) Another is being committed to worship God at Church every Sunday, or serving in a ministry or mission event, or inviting a neighbor to church, or praying (speaking) with God daily.

As we close out the year I want to invite you to consider a deeper level of commitment for 2016 that you experienced this year. Why? Because we are called, as Disciples, to always evolve to be more like Christ. Each year we should strive harder to move a little closer to that goal.

Below is a 2016 Commitment to Invest Card. It is a way for you to indicate the areas in which you are determined to grow next year. Maybe you want to move a step closer to giving a full tithe (10%) to the church; maybe you want to commit to worship 3 Sundays a month instead of 1; maybe you want to invite one person to church per month next year; maybe you want to serve God in a new way. Write it down – commit to it – pray for God’s help in achieving the goal – keep this card in your bible or somewhere you will see it as a daily reminder that you are committed to grow into a Disciples of Jesus.

Remove any personal information and instructions from bottles or packages. If not able to get to a drop box, medication can be mixed with undesirables such as cat litter or used coffee grounds and placed in the garbage.
